National Carer Matching Service – NEW!

Carers NZ and its online partner, MyCare are operating this new National Carer Matching Service funded by the Ministry of Health. If you have a disability or support a disabled person under the age of 65 you may be eligible to use this free new service, developed for people with disabilities and their families to help them easily connect with relief carers in their areas. You can ask your NASC to refer you to the service, or self-refer by contacting Jude at Carers NZ (ph 0800 777 797 or email centre@carers.net.nz). Once you've been referred to the National Carer Matching Service by your NASC, or completed the registration process with help, you will be able to post jobs seeking relief carers in your area at the MyCare website, view profiles of available workers/relief carers and directly message them to make arrangements to meet and/or use their services.
