Epilepsy New Zealand Speaks to the Health Select Committee

Dr Peter Bergin represented Epilepsy New Zealand at the New Zealand Parliament on the Petition Request:

That the House of Representatives urge Te Whatu Ora Health New Zealand to fund vagal nerve stimulation (VNS) therapy for adults with intractable, medication-resistant epilepsy as an adjunct treatment.

A third of people continue to have drug resistant epilepsy seizures. The VNS vagal nerve stimulation device may be beneficial in controlling seizures and improve quality of life. Please read the petition put forth on 29 August 2024 here; Link to Petition Request.
